

Level 3 Technical Occupational Entry to Professional Practice for Dental Nurses (Diploma)



Course Overview

As a dental nurse you play a key role in supporting dentists in caring for patients. This programme focuses on the knowledge and skills that you require to register with the General Dental Council and work as a Dental Nurse. It enables you to learn and train on the job as well as giving you a registerable qualification. You will learn as you carry out your normal duties, with the support of a Trainer/Assessor who will visit you in your workplace to carry out observations of your practice during your working hours throughout your course. You will also be expected to attend taught sessions which will provide you with the specialist knowledge underpinning the two summative MCQ exams.

What You Will Study

There are 11 mandatory units and two MCQ knowledge tests.

- Preparing for professional practice in dental nursing
- Health and safety practices in the dental setting
- Prevention and control of infection in the dental setting
- Dental and regional anatomy, oral health assessments and treatment planning
- Recognising and supporting actions during first aid and medical emergencies
- The safe use of ionising radiation to produce quality radiographic images
- Provide support for the control of periodontal disease and caries, and the restoration of cavities
- Provide support during the stages of prosthetic treatments
- Provide support during the stages of endodontic procedures
- Provide support during extractions and minor oral surgery
- Scientific and practical information to support the patient's oral and physical health

Attendance Expectations

You will be expected to complete your Diploma within 18 months.

You will attend taught sessions via Microsoft teams, once per week, and you will attend some taught sessions in Wakefield college during term time.
